



Registering a Cohabiting Partner for a Survivor's Pension

If you have paid into the LGPS on or after 1 April 2008 you can register a cohabiting partner to receive a Survivor's Pension in the event of your death, by completing and returning this form to the Greater Gwent (Torfaen) Pension Fund (the Fund).

Please note that:

- If you are married or are in a registered civil partnership then your spouse / civil
 partner will automatically be covered for a survivor's pension in the event of your
 death.
- A Survivor's Pension for a cohabiting partner is only based on any LGPS membership you may have after 6 April 1988.

What you need to know

In order for your cohabiting partner to be eligible to receive a Survivor's Pension, the Fund must be satisfied that the following conditions have been met for a continuous period of at least 2 years on the date you die:

You were able to marry your cohabiting partner, or form a civil partnership with them;

- You have been living with your cohabiting partner as if you were husband and wife, or as if your were civil partners;
- Your cohabiting partner is financially dependent on you, or you are financially dependent on each other.

In the event of your death, a Survivor's Pension will be payable to your cohabiting partner if the Fund is satisfied that:

- These conditions apply at the date of your death and there has not been a change in your circumstances;
- Your cohabiting partner can prove that the conditions listed above have been met for a continuous period of at least 2 years immediately before your death.
- For example: confirmation that you lived in a shared household with shared household spending; or that you had a bank account or mortgage in joint names.

In the event that the Fund decided not to pay a Survivor's Pension, and your cohabiting partner believed that they were entitled, then they would have the right to appeal.
